# ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD NEWS

All 5 Board members and Fire Chief Chad attended the September meeting. Minutes and money matters were approved, and the group moved on to the Chief's report.

August responses consisted of 1 wildland fire, 1 medical with helicopter transport, 2 medical with transport, and 1 medical non transport, for a total of 53 responses for the year. Volunteers participated in 70 hours of training, bringing the annual total to 465 so far.

Chad reported for the VFA that they're formulating their wish list.

Old business – Mike Black will pick up paperwork on state audit to see what's going on. All purchases have been made and money received from RFA grant.

New stuff started with nonemergency transport matters. Chad would like to see our department continue to support Sky Lakes by providing ground support on a case-by-case basis, which will add revenue to our department. In the future, he would like to add paid staff, with more training and staffing in our community.

Chad would like to purchase a second engine or upgrade 2119. He also would like to investigate the department's legal representative, maybe changing to one who is more proficient in public safety laws.

After welcoming Chad Partington as the official Rocky Point Fire Chief, the meeting adjourned.
