ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD NEWS

Three Board members, Fire Chief,
and Rescue Randy, the department's training
dummy, attended the September meeting.
Minutes were approved, as was payment of
bills. Board agreed to Terry's request to
combine the 2 department bank accounts.

Chad reported 2 medical calls with
transport, 4 medical without transport, 1
MVA without transport, and 1 brush fire.
From the VFA corner, the association
donated \$13,000 worth of medical equipment
to the department.

Old business began with Chad's
announcement that the department had
purchased a power gurney (an absolute
necessity for transporting patients through
snow and up hills in these parts). The VFA
purchased a ventilator and SOLL machine
(cardiac monitor, EKG, and CO2 monitor)
for the department's use.

Chad also reported on progress with
non-emergent transport, which is involving
more research and might mean making our
2nd ambulance available on site for that use.
One of the big concerns is having enough
volunteers available to provide the service,
which would contribute much-needed
revenue for the department. Our fire
department has lost volunteers. Unless
staffing improves, we may need to

consolidate with other local departments to
help each other with staffing. Talks will
continue with Sky Lakes and Fire District I to
determine how best to route and prioritize
calls. The Board approved continuing
investigation into this added service, but no
decisions have been made.

Under new business, Chad announced
he'll host the Annual Fire Chief's September
dinner at the Rocky Point Fire Hall.
