ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD

The April Board meeting had all 5 members present, plus the Fire Chief and 2 guests, who were introduced.

Guest concerns opened with the nonemergent transport issue and how to get County Commissioner approval to proceed. The Board responded that District I voted down the proposal at the Ambulance Advisory Board meeting, and they don't want Rocky Point's vehicle parked in town. The Board contends our department will continue to do non-emergent runs when a call is received and the staff is available. If County Commissioners and District I should approve the plan, the Board will consider it.

Minutes and treasurer matters were approved, followed by the Fire Chief's During March the volunteers report. responded to 1 MVC without transport, 2 medicals with transport, and 18 hours of volunteer training.

Nick Ryan, reporting for the VFA, said the group had purchased a Capstan winch, pressure washer, and a new garage door opener. Nick will be getting his firefighter certification next month, and Greg Sullivan received his Firefighter I certification.

Rita reminded the Board they needed a motion and vote to receive funds from the VFA for running the July BBQ, which was made and passed. Rita also reminded the Board to identify what they want Quilt to fund with proceeds from the 2013 raffle quilt.

Old business kicked off with confirmation that Terry is working with Chad on the upcoming budget committee. Dean Grieb presented an estimate on materials for the new shed, which will hold disaster supplies. Mike Igou will request that Quilt purchase a portion of the materials.

New Business's first item was confirmation that injectors were replaced on the Fire Chief's truck. Yvonne Caroon from Klamath Falls was introduced, with a long list of credentials and experience, and wants to train with our department, serve as a volunteer, and help with non-emergent runs. Chad asked for help from the community in finding a Rocky Point residence for our outof-town volunteers to stay when on duty.
