Nick Ryan, reporting for Chad, summarized department activity for the month—3 MVAs, 8 medical responses, 4 fire calls, and 1 intercity transport. Volunteers logged 54 hours of training. Greg Sullivan submitted his resignation as a volunteer from the department.

Jerry Higgins, reporting for the VFA, brought up using the Aspen Room for new volunteers from out of town. The volunteers would be housed in the Aspen Room during their training and be available for calls. Dave Epling has also offered his home for the same purpose. The Board supported the idea of using the Aspen Room for out-of-town volunteer lodging and will pursue it.

Jerry spoke with a contractor about moving the outside water source to the north side of the fire house. Tony suggested another bid be requested and the project should be advertized in the paper.

Kathy Ross volunteered to chair the 2013 fire department BBQ, with Rita assisting. Board approved both positions in new business.

Terry Roberts purchased, with department funds, a new computer for \$950, which includes programs important to his being able to develop monthly spread sheets of fire department finances. The computer will be for Board member use only.
