ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD

A special supplemental budget meeting was held on September 3rd. The complete minutes of that meeting are on the department's website.

Four Board members attended the August meeting and accepted the minutes and treasurer's report. Glenn was on a fire, so Fred began the Board report with the resignations of Rosie Roberts from the board and Kathy Ross as clerk. Thanks to both of these ladies for their service to the department and the community. Fred thanked Bree Ryan and all the workers in many capacities for stepping in to lead BBO operations on an incredibly successful year. The district sold the brush truck. The Community Garden project still needs donations of funds and lumber.

The Board achieved 2% of the targeted 10% in insurance cost reduction. The DUNS number is in place, SAM registration and 501 c 3 status in process, all to allow the department to receive grant monies. They are also working on reducing energy costs at the fire hall.

The Board passed a resolution concerning expenditures from the Equipment Reserve Fund and provided an update on filling a Board vacancy. Discussion followed on procedures for scheduling a special workshop meeting.

Fred provided the chief's report, which included, sadly, the resignation of Christy McLaren, who is leaving the area. During the month, there were 53 lightening strikes, and firefighting operations included the death of one firefighter and 3 minor medicals. Glenn is

working to prevent any fires in our area. New volunteers were announced - Barbara McIntosh, Al & Jean VanHulzen, Larry Wicklund, Mike Black. and Fred Hill.

Before adjournment, the Board continued discussion of 501 c 3 status, purchasing a water tender, and establishing more water sources in our area.
