The May meeting opened with all Board members present. Two guests were recognized. Minutes and treasurer's report were approved.

Fire Chief Glenn was introduced, who introduced the volunteers and their level of training and certification – Nick Ryan, Christy McLaren, Janice Jensen, Chris Peterson, Terry Roberts, Mickey Wampler, Dwayne McIntosh, and Chad Partington. Be sure and thank these people for their hard work and dedication to the health and safety of our community.

Board President reported on the status of the septic system as well as the recently-approved budget, which is posted on the kiosk and the website, and status of the department's 501 C 3 and DUNS number. Bonnie Todd summarized improvements to lower building costs to the fire hall, as well as energy incentives.

Old business consisted of discussions on the Lake of the Woods Project, SDAO Resolution, and Fire Med subscriptions. New business began with Diane Grieb presenting the department with community contributions of \$680 for the recall, an amount greater than the cost. Fred introduced Fred Endicott, director of the 911 center, who provided the history, membership, and future of the agency.

The final area before adjournment, Good and Welfare, focused on tax-exempt status of BBQ donations and Sandy's suggestion that the Board accept requests for agenda items prior to the meetings, so research can be conducted and better answers be provided.
