ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD

Four Board members, 3 guests, and the Fire Chief attended the March meeting. Minutes and financial matters were approved, with the Fire Chief’s report following.

Volunteers responded to 1 inter-facility transport, 2 medicals without transport, 1 MVA without transport, and 1 non-medical. Volunteers participated in 78 hours of training.

The volunteer association is updating their bylaws and will send a copy to the Board after approval for inclusion in the Directors Manuals. The VFA will purchase the tent for cooking meat at the BBQ. Generator is working, and the electrician will email a copy of the manual to Chad for future reference.

Under Old Business, Mike Igou brought up annual disaster training for the whole community. Rita asked if quilt funds could be used for construction of the building to house disaster equipment. Board members agreed that the VFA should use money to purchase items on their wish list, before turning over BBQ monies. Nick Ryan reported that the fuel pump is fixed.

Rita covered new business with confirmation that all necessary changes have been made to the Board of Directors Manuals

and they have been reprinted. The Business Plan draft was tabled until next meeting. Final reminders consisted of the March 22nd meeting with old and new Board members to review how the budget is compiled, and announcement of the April 28th budget meeting. It will include all Board members as well as 5 elected community member.

Finally, remember that business items must be submitted to Rita by the first of the month for them to be included in the next meeting’s agenda, which will be posted on the kiosk.
