ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD

All 5 Board members, Fire Chief, and 4 guests attended the October meeting. After the opening routine, 3 of the guests brought up the Farmers Market, held on Fridays at the fire hall this summer. Of concern was how many vendors would be allowed. It was determined the matter had nothing to do with the fire department, and the vendors would be responsible for setting rules. Vendors signed an Indemnity and Hold Harmless Agreement.

Minutes and treasurer matters were approved, so the group moved on to the Fire Chief Report. After reporting 3 medical and 3MVA responses, the Chief presented his moving expenses, which the department will pay. Next chief item was the proposal to sell rig 2171, the old ambulance, which the Board approved. They also approved the Chief’s request to replace the Fire Chief truck.

From the Board, Dean pointed out that the BOD Guide addresses the Aspen Room but not the fire department grounds. It will be updated with the inclusion.

The rest of the meeting included new business and a report on volunteer training, the Indemnity and Hold Harmless Agreement, funds distribution approval, funds transfer approval, and plans to hold a

gathering for the community to meet the new fire chief.

Before adjournment, the attendees reiterated how important it is for us to recruit new volunteers. Please consider serving the department. To find out more, call Chief John Koutouzou at 541 356-2205.

In late October, the *Herald and News* carried an article outlining Klamath County’s proposal to close 7 of its 12 transfer stations, including our local one at Odessa. On Oct. 30, the Rocky Point CAT hosted a meeting of Rocky Point residents and land owners to gather input on the issue and submitted those findings, as well as a request for a meeting, to Klamath County Commissioners and the Solid Waste Manager.

County officials assure us that no definite decision has been made and no time line established for any action. They have agreed to come to Rocky Point and engage in conversation about the issue.
